Fourth Sunday of Lent 2025.

Theme: The Goodness of God.

Gospel: Luke 15: 11-32



Then he came to his senses... started recounting the good things found in his father's house, his home, that there is enough ... for all. This son saw his privileged position as son ... how good it is to belong and to experience that belongingness. He preferred to return to that goodness. It is only after reflecting on the goodness of his father that he made a sincere decision to return home.

Perhaps today we can reflect on our experience of God's goodness in our lives, immerse ourselves in the goodness of God ...

Suffering led the lost son to come to his senses. This brought him to a quiet place where he found where and how to get back. Our days are filled with activity and many voices. Moments of silence are helpful to make us see who we are, beloved daughters of God, and then long to be there... return and stay.
